For the 34th consecutive year, this Annual Competition encourages showcasing of evocative literary mastery set upon the music of rhyme and metre. Accurate rhyme and consistent metre are essential technical requirements of the Australian *bush poetry* genre.

Command of cadence and repetition of rhyme, accompanied by shared experiences and language, has traditionally resonated with humans. In the days since Australia's First Poet Adam Lindsay Gordon proved the power of poetry was worth celebrating, many have strived similarly and provided powerful impact on public psyche.

This competition rewards elegant writing excellence as modern creators of 'Australian bush poetry' craft flowing words - with distinctive Australian flavour - to stimulate senses and stir human spirit. Billy's annual and enduring mission is to inspire modern inklings, and recognise them as renowned practitioners of bush poetry.

For a chance to win one of the 13 Blackened Billy Verse Competition Awards, share your verse.

The 2024 Award Ceremony will be held during the 11th Annual Banjo Paterson Australian Poetry Festival in Orange, NSW. The Awards will be announced online, on the afternoon of Wednesday, 21 February 2024, with entrants and supporters able to engage and celebrate together, virtually, in real time.

The 34th Blackened Billy winner will be rewarded with \$1000, a First Prize Certificate and keepsake iconic Billy trophy, customised with the name of the poet and the title of the winning poem.

For your chance to win, submit your superbly crafted verse entries, via post or email, prior to the 30 November 2023 closing date. Entries are restricted to a maximum of 3 per poet.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Entries are to be rhymed and metered bush verse, relevant to modern Australia or Australians, featuring impeccable spelling and punctuation, appropriate language and evocative impact. Offensive language or themes are unwelcome. **Accurate rhyme** and **consistent metre** are predominant requirements.
- 2. Entries must be the author's own work and not previously presented in the manner provided for consideration. It is preferred all entries are fresh to the Competition. Poems awarded a cash prize in prior Blackened Billy Verse Competitions are ineligible for future entry in this Competition.
- 3. Entries must not have been awarded first prize in any written poetry competition by 8 February 2024. Competition organisers are to be advised promptly should an entry become ineligible. The entry fee will be refunded, or credited for later year, and the submitted entry withdrawn from the current Competition.
- 4. Entries are to be typed, on A4-sized page, using 12-point clear typeface (e.g. Arial or Times New Roman), 1.5 line spacing. Poems should sit naked on the page, with only the below footer detail and, if deemed warranted, a brief author's note permitted. Adornments of borders, art or other embellishments risk disqualification of entry as a potentially identifiable 'tell' indicative of author. For multi-page entries, a footer showing title on later pages and 'page <u>x</u> of page <u>y</u>' on all pages is required. A template is available on the website to assist.
- 5. Rank Order Tally will be utilised to determine winning entries and will be adjudicated upon by 3 highly regarded poets with reputable technical proficiency. The 2024 competition will be judged by 2 past winners of multiple notable and prestigious poetry writing competitions. The 3rd member is a published poet of renown, with a quality reputation developed from decades of experience creating and performing many contemporary and popular works.
- 6. Entries may be forwarded by post (1 copy, unstapled, on A4, printed on one side only), or electronically as a Word Document or PDF. The author's name must not appear on any page of submitted verse.
- 7. For the Entry to be deemed eligible, Submission of the poem, Entry form detail and Payment of relevant fees is required by Closing Date 30 November 2023. Please note that revision of earlier entries, prior to the Closing Date, will require submission as a new entry.
- 8. Copyright is retained by the author. Copies of the Entries will be printed by the Promoter for the purpose of Competition Administration and Adjudication. Poems will not be returned unless Evaluation has been sought or constructive comment, or poems have been annotated by the judge(s). Such notes may be forwarded as support or suggestion for entrants to consider. Please advise if you would prefer to not receive uninvited adjudicator feedback. Entrants acknowledge the Promoters right to reproduce the winning poem, in support of the Blackened Billy Verse Competition, in both electronic and print forms, with due credit and without further compensation to the author.
- 9. There is a maximum limit of 3 entries per poet. **Electronic submission closes at midnight AEST on 30 November 2023. Postal entries need to be received by 30 November 2023.** (Delivery times vary and entrants should ensure they allow sufficient time for receipt in Gladstone Qld 4680 from their location)
- 10. Winning entries will be announced, and prizes presented, during a live online Ceremony on the afternoon of Wednesday 21 February during the 2024 Banjo Paterson Australian Poetry Festival. Details will be emailed to entrants in the leadup to the event and made available on the website for supporters to join the fun.
- Winners of First, Second and Third Place will be notified prior that one of their entries is in the top three. The First Placed poem will be read or recited, by either the poet or a proxy, after awarding. The Highly Commended and Commended Awards will be announced during the Ceremony. Full results of Award winners will be made public after the Ceremony and emailed directly to all entrants.

Words on the 13 Awarded Works of BB2023 - Shown in no particular order, these snippets of Adjudicator comments were shared when the Award-winning works were announced in February 2023. Entrants may wish to consider relevance with regards to their particular poem(s) being crafted and considered as an entry of merit in BB2024. Note the 3 members of the competition adjudication panel differ annually.

Do not be afraid to use an exclamation mark; think of your poem as prose, like a newspaper article, and punctuate it as such; a moving poem with good imagery; well-crafted with a uniquely new approach; entertaining poem with a serious message; lovely and lyrical, beautifully written; artistic literary talent with excellent imagery and effective alliteration; quirky, unusual, refreshingly different; twist ending was commented on as clever by all 3 adjudicators; 'engaging poem of succinct form though a longer form would suit this particular competition' versus 'perhaps too long for today's readers'; language applauded for invoking haunting imagery; internal rhyme and unusual metric pattern won favour; enjoyed for its original storyline
