So many well written stories and poems, made it difficult to pick individual winners. The open subject seemed to work well, and students wrote in a free flowing manner. One fault that many struggled with, was that word count. Don't cut off the story just to finish under a number!. Practise editing, and read it out loud. The poetry was generally of a high standard. Take care with rhyming and free flowing verse. Quite a number failed over the last few lines trying to cut the work short. Some that appeared to be free verse, did not fill the criteria to be called a poem! Keep trying and well done to the place getters.
