Judges Comments: The first place told a confident story about an unusual subject that had been well researched. Second place showed really good use of the author's imagination. While some of the place getters followed a set subject, we do not recommend this for entering a competition, as many stories are the same and result in stifled stories that do not develop well. We do see, that as a class project it would be somewhat easier to follow, but this has a restricting effect on the imagination of the children. Word count IS VERY IMPORTANT and also keep in mind, any that finish "to be continued" are dismissed. Beginning, middle and end are the core of a short story and remember to make that story interesting.

Thank you to all the teachers and parents for encouraging young writers. It is our aim to have somewhere to show their talent, and keep writing alive. We hope to see you next year. Well done to the winners.
